Reminders:

Attendance

We return to school **on Thursday 3rd September 2026**. Without an appropriate reason, attendance for all children who do not attend on this date will be unauthorised. **Pupils who miss the first day(s) miss an important induction to the school year that would put them at a disadvantage to their peers.**

Parents and carers of new Nursery and Reception pupils have already received their child's start date, which may differ to the date above.

Another letter will be sent out to parents and carers before the beginning of the new term, regarding arrival and dismissal arrangements for the first days back to school in September.

Arrival and Dismissal Times for September 2026

Arrival: From 8.35 am - Pupils should be in their classroom by 8.45 am and ready to start their lessons. The gates will be closed at 8.45am to maintain security on site. **Please ensure your child/children arrive at school on time. It puts them at a disadvantage if they are late.**

Dismissal: 3.15 pm - Please be prompt when collecting your child.

School Uniform

All pupils should return to school in the correct school uniform. The correct PE kit should be worn for PE. We will inform parents/carers of the PE days on our return. Please make reference to the [school website](#) for information about the school uniform. **Please note that trainers should only be worn on PE days and at all other times, children should be wearing black shoes. Boots are not permitted to be worn in school (with the exception of wellies in Nursery and Reception).** We would like to thank all parents/carers for ensuring that their children are dressed smartly in the correct school uniform.

Bags - Important for Health and Safety in the School - No backpacks for Year 1 to Year 5 please.

Pupils in Year 1 to Year 5 should not bring backpacks into school. They should bring a book bag (it doesn't have to be the school one) as these easily fit in children's trays. This means our corridors remain less congested making it easier to move around and work in. A book bag fits into your child's tray and ensures it is easily accessible for your child to efficiently organise their belongings.

Nursery, Reception and Year 6 are able to have backpacks. Their classrooms are located in the buildings where the cloakroom provision is more generous. We know that many of the Nursery and Reception children need to bring a change of clothes and backpacks are used for this purpose. For our Year 6 children it is now a privilege that comes with being the oldest members of the school and as role models for our younger students.

Stationery - Pencils, pens etc.

We know that many of our students enjoy preparing for the new school term. If they wish, pupils can bring in a small pencil case with a pencil, pen, rubber and ruler. Please ensure your child does **not** have a pair of scissors in their pencil case in school. These are not required, as we have plenty to use in the classroom.

Learning during the summer break

We encourage all the children to take part in as much of the challenge as possible, so they are able to continue to enjoy reading over the holidays.
