2026



Hillingdon Primary School received £21,320 in Sport Premium funding during the 2025-26 academic year. In summary, the Sport Premium Grant was allocated across two main categories:

- Internal Activities: £9542 allocated to extracurricular opportunities, membership fees, and educational platforms.
- External Activities: £11,058 directed towards coaching staff and School Games organiser network.
