

# Computing – the New National Curriculum (Group 2)

Aim: This practical course is designed to ensure that leaders in ICT and class teachers feel confident in teaching and preparing their school for the new computing curriculum.

Session 2: E safety – in an ever changing technological world, what can we do to help ensure that children are cybersafe?

## Day 3: Debugging

Session 1: Computing across the curriculum; opportunities for making links in other subjects and using technology as a powerful learning tool.

Session 2: Going live ... Creating a plan of action to successfully coordinate the implementation of the new curriculum in your own school.
