Year 4 Trip to The Living Rainforest

On Monday 19 November, Year 4 made the exciting journey to The Living Rainforest in Thatcham.

We have been learning all about the Amazon Rainforest in our Topic lessons so this was a great opportunity to see the flora and fauna we have seen in photographs and read about in our books.

During our visit, we saw poison dart frogs, hissing cockroaches, a channel billed toucan, a yellowknobbed curassow, an emerald tree boa, marmosets and much more.

We had a tour of the rainforest where we learnt all about how the animals have adapted to their environments.

One of the things that we learnt was that hissing cockroaches are able to produce sound by forcing air through their spiracles. It sounds like a snake is hissing, this is a great adaptation because it scares predators away. We also learnt that poison dart frogs are bright colours in order to warn predators that they are there and scare them away too.

We headed back to school, full of exciting stories all about our brilliant day!


