We have had a magical start to the Spring term, with children from Reception through to Year 6 taking part in our special Wizards and Witches reading and writing event. Magical Literacy

This January, our children have been delving into the enchanted world of witches, wizards and magical creatures to foster their love of reading and inspire some truly fantastic writing.

From Meg and Mog in Reception to Harry Potter in Year 6, each year group have taken a particular story and used it as a basis for drama, writing and art work.

Our Reception children have been reading Meg and Mog, and made their own props to act the story out. Keep an eye out for Reception's display: the children have annotated photos of themselves recreating the stories.

Year 1 read Room on the Broom and used the story for lots of dramatic role play, focusing on why they thought characters behaved the way they did and how they might have been feeling. They especially enjoyed pretending to be the animals scaring the dragon away!

The children decorated a cauldron and came up with ingredients for a potion and possible effects if someone drank it. They also wrote letters to the witch in the story. As a special treat for their hard work, Year 1 enjoyed watching the short film based on the story and discussed the differences between the two.

Year 2 stopped at the sound of magical, spooky music, dropped what they were doing and read a few more exciting Winnie the Witch stories! They also used some enchanting, preselected words to

Year 3 have enjoyed reading about the adventures of Mildred Hubble, 'The Worst Witch.' The children had a go at writing their own spells based on friendship; how to make a person disappear; and how to make a clone. They also wrote spells based on the Song of the Witches, 'Double, Double, toil and trouble...' and designed spooky witches hats.

Year 4 explored Chapter 7 of Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, The Sorting Hat. The children had great fun taking a quiz which sorted them into the Hogwart's Houses. The children were inspired to create their own houses and wrote poems about them in the style of the Sorting Hat Song. They also created a piece of art work in the style of Van Gogh's, 'Starry Night,' although their drawings had

Year 5 focused on the opening of The Hobbit, when Bilbo meets Gandalf. They explored how Bilbo felt about meeting Gandalf and his suggestion that Bilbo comes on an adventure with him! They then retold the meeting between these two characters in their own words. Year 5 also revisited watercolor techniques and created a painting of the setting of the Hobbit.

Year 6 watched and read parts of Harry Potter Prisoner of Azkaban. They focused on the part where the boggart is introduced to the class. The children had to create their own boggart (something they are scared of), thinking about what it would look like, how it might move and how it would sound. Year 6 created some imaginative passages, describing their boggart coming out of the wardrobe to confront them and explored different sketching techniques to help them illustrate their ideas.

On Thursday 10 January, Year 4 were visited by the 'Perform for All' team and took part in their 'Groove Like An Egyptian' workshop!

The children had a fantastic session learning a section of a dance routine and putting it to music.

They also learnt some interesting facts about the Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses. Year 4 used what they had learnt to choreograph their own section of a dance routine, relating it to one particular God or Goddess. It was groovy!

Attendance News & **Targets**

At the start of the Spring term we held a celebration assembly to recognize those children who had achieved 100% attendance at the end of the Autumn Term. This was a fantastic opportunity to raise the profile of attendance at our school and reinforce the message to our children that good attendance is important and key to their success. Classes 3M and 4C were proud to be acknowledged as having the highest class attendance in the Autumn term in KS2. Well done!

You will also be aware through previous communication and newsletters that the Local Governing Body set an annual attendance target for the school. This year, our attendance target for each child is 97%: this equates to 5 and a half days absence in an academic year. Governors agreed this was a challenging but achievable target for most pupils. It is also in line the Elliot Foundation Academy Trust's expectation for all of its schools.

As the cold weather continues we understand that children will develop colds and coughs however request that children are not kept off school for minor ailments; the school welfare staff happy to administer medication within guidelines and as appropriate. We would also like to remind parents that

support is available if you are having difficulty getting your child to school on time; please speak to our pastoral care manager or welfare team who can offer assistance and advise you of options available.


