Save our Planet!

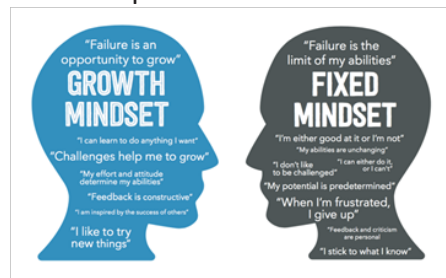

Reminder

Look what we've been up to...

For reception children the start of the term is a really important time for them to settle into life at HPS. We have been settling into school routines, making new friends/ learning each other's names and following the class rules. Our teachers are really proud of us and the start we have made, particularly all of the work we have produced for our topic this term: 'All about me'

This week Year 1 have started their new Mathematics Mastery programme. They have been learning to think deeply about their Maths and use practical resources/concrete manipulatives to support them. They have been representing number using cubes and counters and thinking about more and fewer.



Year 2 thoroughly enjoyed celebrating Roald Dahl's birthday. They worked hard creating pieces of writing all about their favourite RD character, as well creating interesting art work representing the character.

Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Rio and the Paralympics! They have discussed how the athletes have inspired them to fulfil their potential and achieve their dreams. To support their geography skills the children have also been learning about Rio and how the city compares to London. This also inspired them to make fabulous carnival masks with a Brazilian theme!

Year 4 children participated in a fun and energetic Samba workshop in support of our new Brazil topic. This workshop was held to enable the children to capture the vibrant

atmosphere of the Rio Carnival and the recent Rio Olympics and Paralympics. The children were enthusiastic throughout and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

Year 5 have been taking on the role of "teacher" and have thoroughly enjoyed teaching their peers. It was an excellent activity that made them realise both their talents and individual skills, but also how difficult it is to teach if someone is not listening!

Year 6 had great fun celebrating Roald Dahl's 100th birthday this week. They explored his autobiographical novel, 'Boy', through drama and then wrote diary entries from the perspectives of the different characters. In the afternoon they created some fantastic art work based on the sweet shop in the novel. What a great day!
