This week some of our Year 2, 3 and 5 children took part in some very special Taekwondo sessions. The sessions, run as part of the school games project, give children the opportunity to experience a range of different sports and activities that they might not otherwise get to try. The children thoroughly enjoyed trying out the different kicks, punches and stances. All groups behaved impeccably throughout the sessions and completely threw themselves into the martial art.





Look what we've been up to:

Nursery - As part of our work on 'Where we live', we have been creating buildings from construction blocks. We also had some special visitors - the librarians from Oak Farm library came to tell us about their jobs and what children can do at the library. Each child was given a book pack to take home.



Reception - This week reception have started working with their new RWI groups. Our challenges this week were linked to phonics and reading; the children made cards for their friends and tried to write their names and other words too. The children also practised blending sounds in order to read words in our "Word machine", built castles and made up their own fairy tales stories. We love reading!

Year 1 - :"In June I went to the Moon. I was in a race to get to space. I took my spoon to eat the Moon and I float in my space boat."

Some children in Year One have been finding out lots of information about the moon from non-fiction books and learning to write a poem using rhyming words! Wow. Year 3 - We have had an exciting week in Literacy focusing on the text 'The Tunnel' by Andrew Browne. The children have been using their imaginations to think of what incredible things they might discover after travelling through the tunnel. They have been developing their creative writing skills by using rich and varied vocabulary in their descriptions. Each class in year three participated in a 'Conscience Alley,' where they tried to persuade one of the characters to think whether or not it was a good idea to travel through the mysterious tunnel. The children have been having great fun with the novel and we will be continuing to focus on this text next week!

Our science focus of 'Rocks and Soils' has continued with the children learning about fossil hunters and dinosaurs, as well as how to create their own soil! Alongside this, the children have been writing a letter to a Stone Age boy called 'Ug' explaining how their lives are different to his in 2016.




Year 4 - Following a busy week preparing for class assemblies, Year 4 were lucky enough to have a visit from Mrs Morris and Mrs Chaplin where we enjoyed playing games and talking about information linked to this year's Anti-Bullying theme 'Power for Good'. The children were able to share what they already knew about bullying and the different forms it can take. The children went on to think about how they could use their 'Power for Good' on a daily basis. The children have continued to explore their fantastic and exciting topic, Brazil. This week, the children have looked closely into the effects that deforestation has on the Amazon Rainforest. I think the children were surprised to find out how important rainforests were to

our survival and were also shocked by the impact that deforestation has on the environment.

Year 6 - The children went back in time to the 1940s during a visited to the RAF 'Battle of Britain' bunker in Uxbridge. We discovered it was responsible for supporting the air defence of London and South East England during World War 2. The bunker room was left exactly as it was during 1940 and we saw memorabilia such as uniforms, medals and photographs in the museum. We were told the bunker and everyone involved in the air operations helped Britain to win the war and when Winston Churchill visited in 1940 said,

"Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few". The knowledge of our ex-RAF guide gave us a real understanding of how important the bunker was during this crucial time in history.


Parent Satisfaction Survey
