* A new, more challenging, national curriculum was introduced in 2014. Pupils were first tested on this curriculum at the end of KS1 and KS2 in 2016. Results are no longer reported as levels, and thus percentages are not comparable to previous years. KS2 test scores in 2016 were measured against a national standard. An individual scaled score of 100 represents the expected level and a scaled score of 110 a high level. A new progress measure compares our KS2 pupil results against results for pupils nationally in the same KS1 achievement band.
