Google Classroom Year 6

Dear Parent and Carer,

We hope you and your family remain well and family life is *starting* to return to a more normal routine.

We appreciate the support parents/carers have given to their child/ren with their home learning. For the last two weeks of term there will be a change of focus in the Google classroom. This work is designed to enable our students to prepare for the new school year (2020/2021).

Please see below details of the work that will be set:

- During the week beginning Monday 6th July a maximum of three maths lessons will be posted in the Google classrooms.
- On Monday 6th July, a two week PSHE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) home learning project will be posted.
- On Monday 6th July, information about Hillingdon Libraries' Summer Reading Challenge will also be posted.
- Students will be given the opportunity to complete any work from Google classroom not already completed so they are as up to date as possible.
- Bug Club and Times Table Rockstars websites will continue to be available.

Students will be introduced to the PSHE learning and Summer Reading Challenge during their video conference with their class teacher and senior leader.

They will have two weeks to complete the PSHE project and upload their work before the Google classrooms are closed for the summer holidays. Students can *choose* to continue with the project during the holidays. The PSHE project is called 'Being in My World' and the children will be



encouraged to write about themselves and their family. Please see the link below for more information.

This year the Summer Reading Challenge features the Silly Squad. There is information in the links below about how your child/ren can sign-up digitally if you would prefer not to visit a library at this point.

Merry the giraffe! Merry loves telling tall tales and likes relaxing with a spot of non fiction.






Snook the penguin! He's a fish guzzling fiend who can't resist a funny novel!

- Complete the Challenge and you'll get your own certificate!

What books can I read?

You can read any book, magazine, comic, newspaper or website you like. Although you are not able to borrow a book from school to take home at the moment, you can read books you have at home and also books online, from **Bug Club**, and **First News**.



- Video daily life in your house/a family outing (now restrictions are being lifted)
- Use of Google Doc and Google Slide to present your findings
- Use of pen and paper to present your findings
- Be creative- use art and models


My Family Tree








View from my window








My neighbourhood

My Hero

- ★ Was there a time when your hero looked after you, did they do something that made you feel extra safe and loved?
- ★ What does your hero look like? Have they got shiny hair, beautiful skin??
- ★ Do they make you feel warm and fuzzy inside? Why?

Adapt the poem on the following page, to fit your own hero.

The *Dad* poem is the original poem and as times have changed some of the verses are not relevant any more. We have changed the *Mum* poem to reflect this. It tells us more about the person we know now. The poem doesn't need to be about a parent, it could be a family member that you look up to, grandparent or a sibling!
