To support these assessments, pupils sit national curriculum tests in maths and English (reading and spelling and grammar), known as standard attainment tests (SATs). Teachers use the results of the tests, along with the work each pupil has done during the year, to make an assessment of the child's progress at the end of Key Stage 1.</i>
