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Personal Development Curriculum Importance of Safeguarding

Dear Parents and Carers.

You will be aware that, as a part of your child's educational experience at Hillingdon Primary School, we aim to promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive taught programme of Personal Development that gives children and young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live healthy, safe, productive and fulfilled lives, both now and in the future.

Our Personal Development Curriculum is broken down into 6 units across the year. The final unit of the summer term is called 'Changing Me,' and a component of this unit is teaching pupils the correct scientific terminology for their body and private parts to enable them to learn important skills to help to keep them safe. During these lessons, class teachers will introduce a range of safety skills and ideas in an age appropriate way. These include:

- "appropriate" and "inappropriate" touching;
- your child's right to say no to things that make them feel upset or uncomfortable;
- naming parts of the body; and
- who your child can turn to if they ever feel upset or worried.

Working in partnership with parents to promote the safety of our pupils is important to us.
